MISSISSAUGA, ONT. May 6, 2014 – Canon Canada broke ground on its new Canadian Headquarters on Tuesday in Brampton, Ontario. Canon Canada Executives were joined by Japan's Ambassador to Canada, Norihiro Okuda; Consul-General of Japan, Eiji Yamamoto; Brampton Mayor Susan Fennell; and Brampton City Councillor John Hutton.

Located at the corner of Mississauga Road and Steeles Avenue West, the new headquarters will replace the company's current office in Mississauga, which has been its home since 1984. Canon expects to complete construction on the five-storey state-of-the-art building by December 2015.

"Our vision for Canon Canada's headquarters goes beyond being an infrastructure investment or a building where our employees work," said Ted Egawa, President & CEO, Canon Canada Inc. "We want our new headquarters to become a community for our employees and for our customers, which aligns with our Kyosei philosophy, which means harmoniously living and working together for the common good."

The Province of Ontario has designated Brampton as an urban growth area; by 2031 the City's population is expected to grow to 725,000. Canon joins a growing list of organizations such as Loblaw, HBC, Chrysler Canada, Rogers Communications, Maple Lodge Farms and Canadian Tire who've realized the long-term benefits of investing in Brampton.

Canon is seeking to achieve Gold certification for its new headquarters under the Leadership in Energy and Environmental design (LEED) rating system. Sustainable design elements planned include: the incorporation of lots of natural light, energy-efficient equipment and collecting rain water for reuse.

One of Canada's most celebrated architectural firms, Moriyama & Teshima — known for such iconic buildings as the Ontario Science Centre in Toronto and The Canadian War Museum in Ottawa — will lead the design efforts for the new building.
